Dear Parents/Carers

The children have made an impressive start to the New Year with their enthusiasm for learning all the new topics. NSPCC speak out stay safe programme

This half term, both KS1 and KS2 were visited by the charity NSPCC (and their mascot Buddy) and received a talk called 'Speak Out, Stay Safe'. The charity held different assemblies for KS1 and KS2 before leading workshops for Years 5 and 6. The children listened and participated brilliantly while they learnt about different types of abuse so they can get help if or when they need it. They took part in activities, including looking at different scenarios and deciding whether they are OK or not OK. They also learnt about ChildLine, and how the service can support them.

Coram Life Education Bus

We have had the Life Education Bus in during January. This involved the children going outside and having a PSHE session on board the bus. The children all really enjoyed this and talked positively about their experiences.

Young Voices

On Wednesday 30th January, the children in Year 6 travelled to London to attend Young Voices at the O2 arena. Young Voices is the largest school concert in the world, where 5,000 children sing as a choir to a capacity crowd of 15,000 people. This year, the children sang a variety of songs, both old and new, and were joined by famous stars including Tony Hadley from Spandau Ballet. It was a wonderful opportunity for the children who behaved impeccably throughout, and we delighted to be able to offer them the chance to travel to London for this fantastic event.

Parking

The school car park will be locked from 8:30am to 9:15am and 2:45pm to 3:30pm. Parents and staff will not be allowed to drive into the school car park at these times. Please ensure you park considerately outside of the school, ensuring you do not block anyone's driveway or emergency access point.

Red Post Box in Office Reception Area

Envelopes and forms should be posted in the red quick drop box in the office reception area, please ensure all items are clearly named and easily identifiable. We encourage you to use this facility to save you time unnecessarily waiting.

Winhills Wraparound Club

Please can I remind you that all bookings and cancellations should be made via the school office. 24 hours notice must be given if your child cannot attend a session to avoid being charged. Breakfast is between 7.30am and 8.30am. Please let the staff know if your child has not had breakfast at home. Children attending after school club sessions from 4.30pm onwards will be provided with tea. Please speak to staff if you wish to see the menu.

Term time holidays

Following Government Guidance, we as a Trust do not authorise leave during term time unless there are extra ordinary circumstances, which are judged on an individual basis. As a result of this we will apply to the Local Authority for a penalty notice if you take a child out of school for any unauthorised leave of more than 3 days.

School Uniform

Children need to have their PE kit and a pair of wellies in school at all times.

As a reminder, the standard uniform consists of:

- White or blue polo shirts (plain)
- Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore with the length of skirt to be no shorter than just above the knee
- Grey or white socks, royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan (available from school with the school emblem)
- Royal blue pullover or cardigan.
- Black footwear, shoes (not trainers)

Hair – all long hair to be tied back, so that your child's vision is not impaired. Girls and boys may wear gel, ponytails or hair bands, but no extreme fashion hairstyles please. **Please name every item of your child's school uniform.**

It is The Diamond Learning Partnership Trusts policy that earrings must not be worn for PE, and your child must be able to remove them if they wear them to school on PE days. Earrings should be small studs.

PE Kit

The children need a plain white t-shirt and plain blue/navy or black shorts. Please avoid strappy tops for the girls.

If your child comes to school without the appropriate items or kit a letter will be sent home with them indicating the missing item or appropriate school wear.

Uniform points will not be given out to pupils if they do not have the correct kit. If children do not gain enough points over the term they will need to come to school in their uniform on reward day.

School Dinners

The cost of a meal at school from September for children in Year 3, 4 5 & 6 is £2.25, meals for nursery children are £2.00 and adult meals are £3.20. Payment can now be made online, please ask the office staff for more information. You may order lunches on a daily basis but according to Local Authority's policy, all school lunches must be paid for in advance or on the day taken. School is not allowed to give more than one day's credit per child. As you know, any parent, grandparent, aunt or uncle can book to have a dinner with a child in the school any day of the week but we do require at least one day's notice where possible.
