Reception visited Paxton Pits earlier this term. They had an amazing time where they got to try lots of different outdoor activities such as Pond Dipping. The children all came back to school so excited to tell everyone about their trip. Paxton Pits staff commented on how well behaved all of the children were. Well done Reception.

Year 1 and 2 school trip to Woburn Safari Park

On Wednesday 10th July, Key Stage 1 visited Woburn Safari Park. Our topic this term has been all about Africa and the children have learnt a lot about different African animals and their habitats. At Woburn they were able to see a wide range of animals that they have been learning about. We went around the road safari where we saw elephants, giraffes, lions, tigers, bears and much more. In the foot safari part of the park, they had a talk from one of the rangers about the meerkats where they learnt lots of amazing facts about these little animals. The children had a wonderful day and their behaviour was excellent throughout. They came back to school with lots of new facts and information that they had learnt.

Year 3 school trip Buckingham Palace

Year 3 were extremely lucky to visit Buckingham Palace! They had their own tour around the Royal Mews and the Queens Gallery. During the tour of the Queen's Gallery, they learned all about Leonardo Da Vinci and took part in a creative writing workshop which they will use to help them with their poems in English. They were fascinated to learn about the Queen's horses and that there is a carriage specifically used to carry the crown and nothing else. They asked insightful questions and finished the day off by walking round to view the huge palace in its entirety.

Year 5 School Trip National Space Centre Leicester

At the end of June, Year 5 had a fantastic visit to the National Space Centre in Leicester. They were able to learn about astronauts and their space suits, even finding out about how they live in space by stepping inside a replica of part of the International Space Station. They also climbed the iconic rocket tower to discover all about the Russian-American space race and Apollo 11 which landed on the moon fifty years ago this month. Finally, they travelled to the edge of the universe and the beginning of time by experiencing a thrilling planetarium show. Everyone had a brilliant time and learnt so much which built on their science topic from earlier in the year!

Bosch 5/6

Years 5 and 6 visited one of our local businesses, Rexroth, in June for a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) morning. During the sessions, the children were introduced hydraulics and pneumatics, through a number of practical activities. This included using air to power mini cars, rockets and helicopters, using an air powered lift and using hand pumps to inflate tyres to lift heavy loads. They also got to use the Bosch hydraulic training units, where oil was used as a hydraulic substance. It was a fantastic morning where the children were able to continue their learning linked to the science topic of forces, whilst understanding a number of future opportunities in the local area.

Bosch 3/4

Year 3 and 4 at Winhills were very lucky and had BOSCH Rexroth last week. The classes took part in a range of engineering activities which included looking into hydraulics. They worked well in teams and even had competitions in launching rockets across the playground using force.

This project across the school has not only been fantastic in improving the children's love of STEM but also has been a great community link which have shown the children a range of different jobs on offer in the local area. It is a partnership that will continue into the next academic year.

Cricket fixtures

Winhills have taken part in many cricket competitions this term. Year 6 girls and boys competed in the tournament at Eaton Socon Cricket Club and played extremely well. They showed great sportsmanship and learnt many new skills such as overarm bowling. They had a fantastic time and displayed enthusiasm for the sport.

Year 4 also took part in a cricket tournament. After going to Mr Duff's cricket club after school, they were very well prepared! They had an amazing time and came second in the tournament after being beaten by Middlefield in the final. Well done all of you!

Year 2 Music Festival

The children in Year 2 worked very hard in preparation for the annual St Neots Music festival. The children, along with 7 other schools from across the town, came together to sing and perform music based on the topic 'Water'. Each school had created their own sea life creature in order to collaborate together to perform as one. The children thoroughly enjoyed their festival and were a credit to the school. Well done Year 2.

Arsenal After School club

On 16th July, 17 children from KS2 travelled to London as part of their after-school club, the Arsenal Double Club. For the past term, the children have been attending the club, where they spend one week playing football and the next week learning German. They have worked through their German workbooks, learning everything from basic words and phrases to specific football vocabulary - all in German! During the day, the children got a full tour of the Arsenal stadium, including looking in the changing rooms, directors' box and press rooms, whilst completing a German quiz. They looked at the different opportunities languages can offer in the future and spoke about how important speaking another language is to Arsenal as a club. It was a wonderful opportunity and we hope to be able to offer it to the children again next year.

Parking

Little Gems Before and After School Club

Please can I remind you that all bookings and cancellations should be made via the school office. 24 hours notice must be given if your child cannot attend a session to avoid being charged. Breakfast is between 7.30am and 8.30am. Please let the staff know if your child has not had breakfast at home. Children attending after school club sessions from 4.30pm onwards will be provided with tea. Please speak to staff if you wish to see the menu.

Term time holidays

Following Government Guidance, we as a Trust do not authorise leave during term time unless there are extra ordinary circumstances, which are judged on an individual basis. As a result of this we will apply to the Local Authority for a penalty notice if you take a child out of school for any unauthorised leave of more than 3 days.

School Uniform

Children need to have their PE kit and a pair of wellies in school at all times.

As a reminder, the standard uniform consists of:

- White or blue polo shirts (plain)
- Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore with the length of skirt to be no shorter than just above the knee
- Grey or white socks, royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan (available from school with the school emblem)
- Royal blue pullover or cardigan.

Black footwear, shoes (not trainers)

Hair – all long hair to be tied back, so that your child's vision is not impaired. Girls and boys may wear gel, ponytails or hair bands, but no extreme fashion hairstyles please. Please name every item of your child's school uniform.

It is The Diamond Learning Partnership Trusts policy that earrings must not be worn for PE, and your child must be able to remove them if they wear them to school on PE days. Earrings should be small studs.

PE Kit

The children need a plain white t-shirt and plain blue/navy or black shorts. Please avoid strappy tops for the girls.

If your child comes to school without the appropriate items or kit a letter will be sent home with them indicating the missing item or appropriate school wear.

Uniform points will not be given out to pupils if they do not have the correct kit. If children do not gain enough points over the term they will need to come to school in their uniform on reward day.

School Dinners

The cost of a meal at school for children in Year 3, 4 5 & 6 from September is £2.25; adult meals will be £3.20. Payment can now be made online, please ask the office staff for more information. You may order lunches on a daily basis but according to Local Authority's policy, all school lunches must be paid for in advance or on the day taken. School is not allowed to give more than one day's credit per child. As you know, any parent, grandparent, aunt or uncle can book to have a dinner with a child in the school any day of the week but we do require at least one day's notice where possible.
