Mathematical development

The children have been measuring their feet using cubes and comparing the measurements.

They have been ordering objects in terms of size and using the vocabulary small, smaller smallest, big, bigger, biggest.

The children have been counting and recognising numbers to 20 and beyond. They have been answering questions such as 'what is 1 more than 12?' The children have been using numicon to support their understanding of the concepts of 'more and less'

English development

The children now know the sounds m, a, s, t, p, c, k, i, d, n, o, g and are making good progress with their writing. They have even started to blend cvc words!

They have been writing prescriptions and taking down patients' details in the doctors role play area; improving their knowledge of 'people who help us.'

They have learnt more songs and rhymes so ask them to sing you one of their favourites!
