English

Throughout the last two weeks, both year 1 and 2 have been looking at the text 'One day on our blue planet in the savannah'. They have been sorting fiction and non-fiction texts, and identifying the differences between facts and opinions. In both year groups, we have been writing factual sentences about African animals. We used our senses to help us imagine what life on the savannah would be like.

Mathematics

In Year 1 the children have been working on their fraction knowledge. They have been looking at 1/3, 1/4 and 1/2 of amounts and shapes. They have used a variety of resources to show their workings.

In Year 2, the children have been securing their knowledge and understanding of calculation methods. They have also been applying these skills and methods to test style questions in preparation for their forthcoming SATs.

ICE Zone

The children have been enjoying the new topic of Africa this term. They have explored the Ndebele houses and created their own designs. During DT the children have designed and created their own African drum. The children have been exploring the world and have started locating various countries, oceans and cities.
